We are delighted to be welcoming back Midnite Youth Theatre (Perth WA) for their fifth visit to Warwick. *The Dunes* is a new Australian play about family, memory and the ghosts we carry. Set against the shifting sands of a coastal town, *The Dunes* is a haunting, intergenerational story where memory, myth, and family intertwine. When a fractured family reunites at their seaside home for Christmas, old tensions rise to the surface—along with something older and stranger buried beneath the dunes themselves
